



### Parish Council Meeting Summary 03/18/25

- Bruce suggested we revise our elevator pitch to be 30 seconds to one-minute tops. All members will share their revision at our next meeting and use it when appropriate.
- Tim presented a welcome booklet to the PC to include church info, contact information, history of the church, etc. These are to distribute to catechumens or visitors who are repeat attenders. The booklets would cost about \$5 and be kept in a designated area.
- John Marc discussed updates about the ramp vs. lift installment at the St. James House. The PC
  agrees that the lift seems more practical. John Marc will continue to discuss the best options with
  Josh Arvidson as he has experience in this area.
- There is roughly \$79,000 accumulated PFD tithes for this project and the possibility of access to grant money. The plan is to ensure the lift max will accommodate 1,000 pounds. Safety concerns are the priority. We will discuss the lift vs. ramp options at the next church family meeting.
- The PC will review the church constitution. Fr. Marc, Martha Fisher, Jennifer Gillquist, and Sydney Ihde will begin looking at any necessary adjustments needed. Proposed changes will be presented at the next Parish Council meeting and church family meeting.
- The Financial Report by Marshall was moved to the next PC meeting due to Marshall being unavailable.
- We plan for the next church family meeting to take place from 5:30p to 7p on May 17, 2025.
   Church members will be given a summary of what will be discussed at least one week prior to the family meeting.
- A PC retreat will take place on July 12, 2025, at the Dunaway's cabin.

- The PC revisited the question around "closed meetings," and decided to return to the policy previously in place. PC meetings are open for any parishioners to attend and listen.
- School Status: Tim updated the PC on the school. The school is doing well implementing training
  from the Murdoc Foundation. The school will hold an outdoor BBQ May 9th instead of an end of
  year program. The School and Parish will continue to work hand in hand.
- Cupola Status: Tim updated the status of the chapel cupola project and bids. For installation, \$3,000 for helicopter installation and \$12,000 for the ground crew. Ground crew would include installation, building/removal of scaffolding, and roof inspection. Myles and Sam to begin Cupola construction and assembly.
- John Marc updated the PC on the Maranatha House renovation. It is going well but has gone over the projected budget and work time. They unexpectedly had to cut out mold, rewire lighting, change plumbing, and update the shower floor, etc. He also updated the PC on the Parish Home maintenance. It is a work in progress but going well.
- \$250 was approved to be donated to Alexis Clodfelter's new clergy vestments.
- Next PC meeting: April 29, 2025, 7:00p to 8:30p in the church basement.





THE SYNAXARION

John of the Ladder – 4th Lent



On March 30, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the New Hieromartyr Zachariah, metropolitan of Corinth; and Sophronios, bishop of Irkutsk.

On this, the Fourth Sunday of Great Lent, we make remembrance of our godly father, John Climacus, the author of *The Ladder of Divine Ascent*.

Verses

John, dead in the flesh and also living, lives eternally, even though appearing dead and without breath.

Leaving his words as a ladder for the journey upwards, he shows his pursuit of the journey upwards.

The Church also commemorates him on March 30 when he reposed. The celebration of his feast on this day

probably arose from the custom prevalent in the honorable monasteries of starting the Great Lent with the reading of his book of sermons, in which John describes the method of elevating the soul to God, as ascending a ladder. John of the Ladder came to Mount Sinai as a 16-year-old boy and remained there, first as a novice under obedience, and afterwards as a recluse, and finally as abbot of Sinai until his eightieth year. One time, Moses, a disciple of his, fell asleep under the shade of a very large boulder. John, in prayer in his cell, saw that his disciple was in danger of the boulder toppling over on him and prayed to God for him. Later, when Moses returned, he fell on his knees and gave thanks to his spiritual father for saving him from certain death. He related how, in a dream, he heard John calling him and he jumped up and, at that moment, the boulder tumbled. Had he not jumped, he would have been crushed. John Climacus died around the year 563 A.D.

Through his intercessions, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
