





Holy Prophet Daniel Feast Day - December 17

"The God of Heaven will raise up a Kingdom which shall never end"

The blessed Daniel the Prophet was from the royal tribe of Judah. While still young, he was led away with his three young companions to Babylon around 605 B.C. Chosen for service to the King they received new names: Daniel was named Baltassar, Hananiah (Shadrach), Mishael (Meshach), Azariah (Abendnego). They were raised in the royal palace and taught the wisdom of the Chaldeans. Several years later Daniel, after having interpreted the mysterious dream of King Nebuchadnezzar, was made governor and chief prefect of the whole province of Babylon. Under the reign of Nebuchadnezzar's son, Belsassar, Daniel explained the

handwriting on the palace wall to the King. He was then made one of the three great ministers. Falsely denounced by his enemies, he was thrown into the lion's den, but, sustained by assistance from on high he closed the lion's mouth. The three young youths, having refused to prostrate themselves before a statue of Nebuchadnezzar, were thrown into a white-hot furnace but remained untouched by the flames. Daniel and his companions all lived to old age but died in captivity. They are commemorated by the Church on the two Sundays before the Nativity of our Lord.

THE SYNAXARION

Nathanael of the Twelve - Transfer of Relics & Titus of the 70 – August 25



On August 25, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the return of the holy relics of the holy glorious Apostle Nathanael.


Verses

Nathanael is found, though he was hidden, that we the faithful might reap grace in abundance. Your body was found on the twenty-fifth, O Nathaniel.

When Nathanael, also known as Bartholomew, was crucified in Armenia, Christians removed his body and honorably buried it in a lead casket and placed it in a tomb. When numerous miracles and healings occurred over the grave of the apostle, causing an increase in the number of Christians, the pagans

uncovered the casket containing the relics of Nathanael and tossed it into the sea. They did the same to the bodies of four other martyrs. However, by God's providence, none of them sank and the current carried them to separate but safe shores. Agathon, the bishop of the island of Lipara, mystically learned of Nathanael's approaching relics and, with the clergy and people, came to the shore to receive them with great joy. On that occasion, many healings of the sick occurred from the relics of the holy Nathanael.

On this day, we also commemorate the holy Apostle Titus of the Seventy, bishop in Crete. Titus was born in Crete and educated in Greek philosophy and poetry. Following a dream, he began reading the Prophet Isaiah and doubted all the wisdom of the Hellenes. Hearing about Christ the Lord, Titus traveled to Jerusalem with other Cretans and personally heard the words of the Savior and witnessed His mighty works. His young heart completely adhered to Christ. Later, he was baptized by the Apostle Paul whom he served as a son in evangelization. Titus was present at the suffering and death of Paul in Rome and honorably buried his body. After that, Titus returned to Crete where, with great success, he baptized the pagans and prudently governed the Church of God until his repose at age 94.



On this day, we also commemorate our Holy Fathers Menas, Epiphanios, Gennadios and John, archbishops of Constantinople. By the intercessions of Your Saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
