

## New Parish Council Members, Parish Mission Statement, and Revised Parish Governance Structure

**New Members:** As a result of our Parish Council training and workshops over the last three to four months, we will enroll two new Parish Council members: Martha Fisher and Marshall Alexander. They will join current members: Laurie Snider, Jennifer Gillquist, Ann Patras, Will Klatt, David Lindblom, Bruce Johnson, and Sydney Ihde. Fr. Marc Dunaway is an *ex officio* member of the Parish Council as pastor, as are Fr. Robert Polson as assistant priest, John Marc Dunaway as Facilities Manager, and Tim Mellor as Parish Administrator.

Mission Statement: Part of the work done in our workshop was to draft a Mission Statement for Saint John's and to identify our main Core Values. A Mission Statement declares the purpose of an organization, defining why an organization exists and why its members are motivated to do what they do. In our workshops we tried to define how the larger mission statement of the Church as found in Matthew 28:18-19 is especially accomplished or emphasized in our setting, with the talents and gifts God has given us. A mission statement should also be concise and even inspirational, something that can be memorized. Core Values are ideas that drive an organization's actions and decisions, and with which everything we do must align. Our Parish Council would appreciate your review and feedback on this expression of our Mission Statement and Core Values.

**Revised Structure:** The final part of our work was to set forth a new structure of governance for our Cathedral. This is defined in the document we worked through: Setting a Revised Structure of Governance for Saint John Cathedral. This document is also available online and would be good for every member of our Parish to read. In the revised structure of our Parish Council, Martha Fisher and Bruce Johnson will now serve as co-chairs, Sydney Medders as Secretary, and Marshall Alexander as Treasurer.

Overall, our Parish Council is excited about the work we have done and looks forward to Parish-wide discussions in the year ahead as we grow and implement these changes.

#### **Reminders for Coffee Hour**

All families in the parish are encouraged to not just attend coffee hour, but to act as the host on scheduled weekends. ## Saints of North America – 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after Pentecost Kyriaki of Nicomedia – July 7



On this day, the Second Sunday after Pentecost, it is customary to remember the saints of one's own land. In our case, then, we commemorate all the Saints of North America, both known and unknown.

Saints of all times, and in every country are seen as the fulfillment of God's promise to redeem fallen humanity. Their example encourages us to "lay aside every care, and the sin which so easily besets us" and to "run with patience the race that is set before us." The local saints of our land can especially teach us how we should live and inspire us to grow as Christians. In addition to the well-known and familiar saints that we have come to recognize, we also honor those saints who are known only to God and have not been officially recognized by the Church.

As we contemplate the lives of these saints, let us remember that we are also called by God to a life of holiness.

On July 7, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy and glorious Great-Martyr Kyriaki of Nicomedia.

#### Verses

Though Kyriaki dies before beheading, she is willingly perfected by the sword. On the seventh, Kyriaki ascended to her Betrothed.

Kyriaki means "the Lord's day" in Greek. Her devout Christian parents, Doretheus and Eusebia, gave their only child this name because she was born on a Sunday. From her childhood, Kyriaki consecrated herself to God, restraining from everything that unruly children do. When she matured, beautiful in body and soul, many suitors came to ask for her hand in marriage, but Kyriaki refused them all, saying that she betrothed herself to Christ the Lord and desired to die as a virgin. One of the rejected suitors denounced Kyriaki and her parents to the Emperor Diocletian as being Christians. The emperor ordered that her parents be tortured and banished to the town of Melitene where they died for Christ. Kyriaki endured trial and similar tortures. When Kyriaki lay in her prison cell, completely covered with wounds, Christ the Lord appeared to her, healed her and said: "Kyriaki, do not be afraid of torture. My grace is with you." When she was taken from there for beheading, Kyriaki - bearing in mind all of the glorious martyrs



before her - offered one last prayer that God would have mercy and save all those who would celebrate her memory, and to give rest to her soul together with the souls of her parents. Kyriaki rendered her soul to God just before the sword was lowered on her head. Many pagans believed in Christ through her, and also received martyrdom. Kyriaki was received into eternal joy in the year 289 in Nicomedia.

On this day, we also commemorate Venerable Thomas of Mount Maleon; Hieromartyr Evangelos, bishop of Tomi (Constanta) in Romania; New-martyr Polycarp; and Eudokia, princess of Moscow.

By the intercessions of Your Saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
