"Meatfare Week" – A Warm-up to Fasting February 24 – March 1

In many ways the Church invites us to think ahead and be intentional about our spiritual journey through the season of Lent. One of these is this coming week before the fast of Lent begins. During this week the Church asks us to fast from meat only as a kind of warm-up to the full fasting that begins on "Clean Monday." **Fish, wine, oil and dairy are allowed everyday of this week**. I realize that for some fasting from meat is the extent of their Lenten fasting and that even this in our culture today is quite a remarkable effort. Still, I encourage everyone to be mindful in some way of this "Meatfare Week" and to use it to prepare your family for the effort of Lent.

"Church Etiquette" Tip of the Week

When we gather to worship God, Orthodox Christians are "at home" in the environment of the Church gathering and yet at the same time reverent. These tips on "Church etiquette" explain some of the common customs that contribute to the reverent atmosphere of Orthodox worship. They are intended as guidelines to observe, not to judge one another, which by a higher law we are forbidden from doing. (We will be adding a 'Tip of the Week' for the next several weeks in the bulletin.)

Receiving Holy Communion

The reception of Holy Communion is the high point of the Divine Liturgy. The following tips will help both the clergy and the faithful carry out the distribution of Holy Communion with reverence and dignity.

• While in line, cross your arms over your chest, right arm over left. By doing this, there is no need to make the sign of the cross at the chalice or hold the communion cloth.

• Step close to the chalice.

• Wait for the priest or deacon to finish the prayer before stepping away.

• It is best to hold an infant or toddler cradled in your right arm when bringing them forward for communion. By doing so, it is easier for the right-handed clergy to serve them communion.

Handling the Blessed Bread (Antidoron, Greek)

Try not to drop crumbs from the antidioron (blessed bread) that we receive after communion (often given out after kissing the cross). The fewer the crumbs on the floor, the less there is to vacuum. It is also appropriate to share the blessed bread with visitors. It is blessed — not consecrated Communion — and as such is a gift to all who wish to partake of it.

## Last Judgment – 3<sup>rd</sup> PreLent

On February 23, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Hieromartyr Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna; Venerable Gorgonia, sister of Gregory the Theologian; Venerable Zebinas, Polychronios, Moses and Damian near Cyrrhus in Syria; and Venerable Damian of a Monastery on Mount Athos.

Today, we commemorate the Second and impartial Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### Verses

When the Judge of all sits to judge the earth, I entreat You: May You judge me with mercy, worthy of Your voice!



It is the Sunday of the Last Judgment – also known as Meat Fare Sunday – which is the lesson that we read in today's Holy Gospel. Jesus illustrates to us God's indescribable goodness and His great love for mankind. And so, lest some who are lazy, loiter and spend their time in the pursuit of sin, rather than spending their time appropriately to their salvation, and then be suddenly

overtaken by death, the divine Fathers decided that on this day the remembrance of the Second Appearance of Christ is to be celebrated. The intention is to remind us all, that God is good and loves mankind, but He is also a very righteous Judge Who rewards each of us according to our deeds. Our Lord teaches us that when we minister to our brother or sister, we really minister to Him. This brings us righteousness and life eternal.

By Your indescribable love for mankind, O Christ God, make us worthy of Your devoted voice, number us among Your righteous ones and have mercy on us. Amen
