



#### **THE SYNAXARION**

#### Synaxis of the Twelve Apostles – Sunday, June 30 All Saints – 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday after Pentecost



On June 30, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we celebrate the Synaxis of the holy, glorious, and all-lauded Twelve Apostles.

#### Verses

The friends of Christ and twelve followers of God do we honor, Whom we rightly call heroes and godly men.

Even though each one of the Twelve Apostles has his own special day of celebration throughout the year, the Church has set aside this day as a festal assembly of all the apostles together and

with them, the Apostle Paul. These are the names of the Holy Apostles and how each one of these holy men historically ended their earthly life: Peter was crucified upside down. Andrew was crucified. James, the son of Zebedee was beheaded. John the Theologian died in a miraculous, peaceful manner, the only one of the twelve to do so. Philip was crucified. Bartholomew (or Nathaniel) was crucified, scraped and beheaded. Thomas was pierced with five spears. Matthew the Evangelist was burned alive. James, the son of Alphaeus was crucified. Thaddeus (or Jude) the Brother of James was crucified. Simon the Zealot was crucified. Matthias was stoned and then was beheaded after death. Paul was beheaded.

On this day, the Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints who shone forth throughout the whole world, North and South, East and West.

#### Verses

#### All the friends and followers of the Lord do we praise; Though we cannot mention them all, they will all be remembered.

David the Prophet and king, who revered the beloved of God, and respected them because of his great piety, said in the Psalms, "How precious are Thy beloved unto me, O God." And the Apostle Paul, in his Epistle to the Hebrews, recounted the lives of the saints, when he wrote, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." Therefore, as Orthodox Christians, we honor the beloved saints of God, respecting them as keepers of God's commandments, shining examples of virtue and benefactors of humanity. We commemorate all the holy ones every year on this day, as the list of saints ever increases, even though some of their names escape us. Nevertheless, we honor them for their piety and strive to imitate their good works.



By the intercessions of Your immaculate Mother, O Christ God, and of all Your Saints from all ages, have mercy and save us, since You alone are good and the Lover of mankind. Amen.
