# Parish Council Meeting Summary – January 25, 2025

- PC members shared a brief statement on why they tithe.
- We continued the ministries presentations, discussing the ministries mission statement, future/goals, and needs. Fr. Marc presented the ERI. Rhonda Clodfelter and Jennifer Saur presented Atrium.
- Myles Kelly and Sam Stogsdill presented the different options for the cupola and answered questions. It was decided that the PC would move forward with their bid to rebuild the cupola.
- The PC discussed the potential for issues with the chapel roof which will be evaluated when its weather permitting.
- The PC started the review of the various options for making the St. James House handicap accessible.
- Sydney reviewed the terms of each parish council member.
- Blake will be beginning the Maranatha house/Bishop's apartment repairs soon.
- The Antiochian Archdiocese of North America created a Youth protect policy training and background check to be completed by each parish council member.
- The Lindblom's will be the new host family of the St. James House starting this summer.
- PC members were asked to begin thinking of ideas to welcome visitors to the church.
- The PC started the discussion about having a PC retreat after Pascha.
- PC unanimously agreed to donate \$500 to St. Athanasius Academy and post the fundraiser letter in the bulletin.
- John Marc updated the PC regarding the church doors. They are latching correctly, security cameras are working, and the locks are working.
- There was a parishioner question asking if the PC meetings are open to parishioners. The PC unanimously voted not to open the meetings due to the personal nature of certain agenda items. The PC agreed to host more frequent family meetings.
- Marshall and Tim will plan to meet with an attorney soon to discuss separating the church and school to mitigate liability concerns.

### "Church Etiquette" Tip of the Week

When we gather to worship God, Orthodox Christians are "at home" in the environment of the Church gathering and yet at the same time reverent. These tips on "Church etiquette" explain some of the common customs that contribute to the reverent atmosphere of Orthodox worship. They are intended as guidelines to observe, not to judge one another, which by a higher law we are forbidden from doing. (We will be adding a 'Tip of the Week' for the next several weeks in the bulletin.)

### **Venerating Icons in the Narthex and Center of the Church**

When entering a church, it is customary to venerate the icon of the patron saint in the Narthex, as well as any festal icon that may be set on a stand in the center of the church. One should wait to venerate an icon in the center of the church (or on the iconostasis) if the clergy are standing before it, or if a scripture reading, censing, or the Little or Great Entrance are occurring at the moment you enter the church.



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# **Prodigal Son – 2<sup>nd</sup> PreLent**

On February 16, in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the Martyr Pamphilos, priest of Caesarea in Palestine and his companions; Venerable Flavian the hermit; and Venerable-martyr Romanos from Solovak of Carpenision.

On this day, we remember the Parable of the Prodigal Son, which occurs in the Gospel and which our deified Fathers brought further honor in the Lenten Triodion.

### Verses

O you who are like me, a prodigal, come forward with confidence and tranquility.

For unto all has been opened the door of divine mercy.

In the parable given to us by our Savior, Jesus illustrates three things: the condition of the sinner, the canon of repentance and the knowledge of God's compassion. For in the person of the prodigal son, we view the wretched condition that sin creates for us: that we are distant from God and His Sacraments. However, when we become aware of ourselves and awaken, we hasten with hope and return to Him through repentance. Our Savior calls back to His mansions all those who have been overtaken by despair, lacking the hope of forgiveness for their grave sins. The Father encourages all his lost children to remove the desperation from their hearts and revive their energies for virtuous deeds.

Through Your inexpressible love for mankind, O Christ our God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
